Typically, glaucoma afflicts elderly patients. In the “typical” glaucoma patient, diagnosis tends to be straightforward and management is often clearly delineated. In many of these cases, there will be a limited period of time that the patient will be under therapeutic management. However, there are instances where glaucoma presents in an “atypical” patient. Usually these patients are younger with a greater time period for therapeutic intervention. Additionally, these younger patients may present the added complication of pregnancy. This lecture examines various types of glaucoma afflicting younger patients and identifies special challenges in diagnosis and especially management. Further, therapeutic strategies are presented to best deal with glaucoma in children, young adults and pregnant patients.

Joseph Sowka, OD, FAAO, Diplomate

Dr. Sowka is a professor of optometry at Nova Southeastern University College of Optometry where he serves as chief of The Advanced Care Service and director of the Glaucoma Service at the College's Eye Institute.

Jim Thimons, O.D.

Jim Thimons, O.D. is an Ohio State University graduate and completed his residency at the Chillicothe VA Medical Center. He is currently the center director for Ophthalmic Consultants of Connecticut and has been one of optometry's most popular lecturers. He is a clinical authority on anterior segment disease and refractive surgery.

Dr. Thimons has received numerous professional awards, authored over 50 publications and conducted eight clinical research projects. He is the clinical professor at the New England College of Optometry and has been voted one of optometry's "10 Most Influential People".

Joseph J. Pizzimenti, O.D., F.A.A.O.

Dr. Pizzimenti is an associate professor at Nova Southeastern University (NSU) College of Optometry. He is internationally-recognized speaker on ocular disease.

Dr. Pizzimenti has completed funded clinical research in the areas of diabetes, age-related macular degeneration and low vision. Dr. Pizzimenti's scientific articles have appeared in Optometry and Vision Science, Pharmacotherapy, Optometry:

Journal of the American Optometric Association, Optometric Education, The Diabetes Educator, Eye Care Review, The Internet Journal of Allied Health Science and Practice, Review of Optometry, Clinical and Experimental Optometry and Sleep Medicine.

Dr. Pizzimenti recently co-authored a chapter on diabetic retinopathy in the textbook titled, *Diabetes in Black America: Public Health and Clinical Solutions to a National Crisis*.

Dr. Pizzimenti resides in Boca Raton, Fla. with his wife, Dr. Claire Pizzimenti, and their three children.

Carlo J. Pelino, O.D., F.A.A.O.

Dr. Pelino is a native of Pittsburgh, Penn. He received a Bachelor of Science degree from Gannon University in Erie Pennsylvania in 1990. He entered the Pennsylvania College of Optometry (PCO) in 1990 and received his Doctor of Optometry degree in 1994. After graduating from PCO, Dr. Pelino did post-graduate residency training at the John F. Kennedy Memorial Hospital in Philadelphia. His residency training had an emphasis in ocular disease.

Following residency training, Dr. Pelino joined the clinical faculty at The Eye Institute of the Pennsylvania College of Optometry, where he holds the rank of assistant professor. In 2005 Dr. Pelino did a clinical fellowship with Dr. Stephen Sinclair, a highly regarded Vitreo-Retinal Specialist in Delaware County. Dr. Pelino's fellowship training had an emphasis on medical and surgical management of vitreo-retinal diseases. In addition to caring for patients in the adult primary care service of The Eye Institute, Dr. Pelino also has a referral retinal practice.

Dr. Pelino is a fellow in the American Academy of Optometry. He lectures extensively in his areas of interest (e.g. internal and external ocular diseases) in both domestic and international programs.

Things You Need To Know About Registering for WOA Convention:

- ◆ The deadline for early bird registration is September 1, 2010. After that date the registration fee will increase by \$20.00.
- ◆ All courses will be filled on a first-come, first served basis.
- ◆ The registration form is printed on both sides, one side is "Full Registration" and the other is "Partial Registration." Please only complete one side of the form!
- ◆ There are two choices for registration:
 1. **Full Registration: One fee including your choice of meals and all education classes. Please still select all courses and meals you will be attending.**
 2. **Partial Registration: You choose which classes and meals you want to attend and each is priced separately.**
- ◆ If you plan to attend all or most of Convention, Full Registration is the way to go. If you can only attend a day or two, your best option may be Partial Registration. If you do Partial Registration and the total is more than Full Registration, you may pay the Full Registration amount even if you aren't planning on taking everything.
